Keeping a clean, orderly classroom is important in a Montessori environment. The practical life activities teach children how to take care of the space around the,—from physically cleaning to, on a deeper level, appreciating one's environment.

Examples of activities which promote care of the environment include:

- setting the table
- sweeping and mopping the floor
- watering plants
- washing dishes

Through these activities, children get to make choices about what will makes their environment most beautiful, taking responsibility, and performing a very involved sequence of tasks with a natural sense of order (eg. separating the flowers, filling vases with water, etc.)
