Montessori Focus-Practical Life

What are practical life activities?

Practical life activities are applicable for all ages, and evolve with each stage of development. The activities can start with something as simple as putting a coat on or washing hands.



Why do we love practical life activities? Practical life activities are amazing to support settling in, providing a link between home and school. They support fine and gross motor skills and hand-eye coordination, a preparation for writing. Rather than "just" getting dressed or "just" juicing an orange, children are doing it for themselves, following a complex motor sequence, independently, in order to fulfill his or her own desires and needs. When taught early in life, this helps a children to believe in themselves as well as to develop independence.



What types of practical life activities are there?

- Care of Self: These activities provide the means for children to become physically independent. Activities in this area may include learning to wash one's hands or learning to put on one's clothing.
- Care of the Environment: Keeping a clean, orderly environment is important in a Montessori e classroom. Practical life activities teach children how to take care of the space around them-from physically cleaning to, on a deeper level, appreciating one's environment. These activities may include how to set the table, how to clean dishes, or how to water and care for plants.

There are multiple layers to these activities. They may seem straightforward and repetitive, but a lot is going on under the surface.
